KAENG KRACHAN ELEPHANT PARK - OVERVIEW

Kaeng Krachan Elephant Park and Masoala Rainforest together form a special new focus area in the eastern part of Zoo Zurich. The 6,800 square meter big curved roof of the inner enclosure is particularly eye-catching. It was designed as a flat, freely-shaped wooden frame. Light is provided by 271 skylights made of UV-permeable ETFE foil covering. It is a net-like, transparent organic structure that is in harmony with the surrounding woodland. The inner enclosure is 80 metres in diameter. The wooden roof does not require any columns or support structures of any kind inside.

Great importance was attached to sustainability during the construction of Kaeng Krachan Elephant Park. The main building material is wood. Heating is provided via a district heating network using the central woodchip heating system at Zoo Zurich. Rainwater is collected from the roof in order to be used for watering the ground, for moistening the sand, for removing dust from the plants and for supplying the pool maintenance equipment. An ingenious control system ensures that the air-conditioning in the inner compound conserves natural resources as much as possible.
